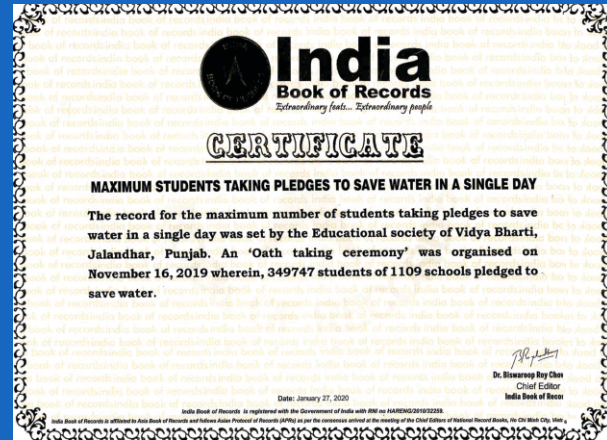

School Admission

Registration for Pre- nursery and Nursery Classes starts on 1st of January and admissions are finalized by March 31st. Admission tests for other classes take place in the last week of March every year, subject to the availability of seats in that class. However all admissions are finalized by 7th of April every year. In class XI provisional admission is given till the results are declared.



Students who seek admission will have to produce the following:

- ◆ The school leaving certificate from the school last attended.
- ◆ The reports of progress and co-curricular activities in that school.
- ◆ Self attested Photocopy of the original Birth Certificate.
- ◆ Students seeking admission in class IX must produce the 2nd language pass certificate of class VIII .
- ◆ No change in the date of Birth will be permitted once the student is admitted.

Academic Session

It begins from First of April every year and ends on the last day of March next year.

Application for Admission

Application form with Prospectus is available in the school office. Forms duly filled must reach the office by 25th of March. Right of admission is reserved with the Principal

Our Fee

Rate of fee depends on the decision taken by the Managing Committee from year to year. (Please ask for the current rates.)

- ◆ Payments against fine (if any) are to be made with the fees.
- ◆ If the dues are not deposited in time, the name of the student Shall be struck off from the school. Re-admission will only be possible with the permission of Principal on payment of re-admission fee of Rs.500.

Attendance

A student is supposed to be in the school, for at least 75% of working days. Leave application must reach the office by 9 a.m. on that day, failing to which Rs.5/per day will be charged and student will be marked absent. If a student remains absent for six days, his name will automatically be struck off.

- ◆ No leave application will be entertained if not properly endorsed by the parents or authorised guardian.

Parent Teacher Meeting

Parents are not allowed to meet any teacher without the prior permission of the Principal. During School hours parents are not allowed to visit the class rooms of their ward.

Parents must come to school along with their ward (in Uniform) on second Saturday of every month to know about the behaviour and the academic performance

Houses

The school is divided into four sections. Junior section Pre-nursery to Class II, Primary Section Class III to Class V, Middle section is VI to VIII and Senior Section IX to XII. Every Section is further divided into three houses, they are

1. Gobind House

Inter House Activities and Competitions are held to promote a spirit of team work in the students. There is a house master for every house assisted by teachers. 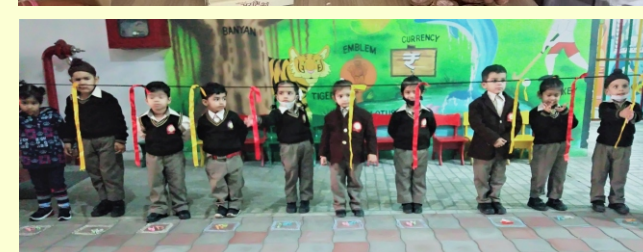


Project

To implement the theoretical knowledge of the students into practical form, presentations and project work are assigned to the students. The Project work is completed by the students themselves with the help of subject experts, books from the library and the internet facility in the school.

Home Work

Homework is given only in four subjects everyday from class III to 10 +2. There is no bag teaching upto class II.

Broad outline for Homework

Homework in English and Mathematics is given everyday. The homework in science, Hindi, regional language and Social Science is given on alternate days.

Holiday Book Test

To promote reading habit among the students, extra reading books are assigned to each class and are given to students. A test on the same is given to each class after the Summer vacation.





Programmes During Summer Vacation

There are programmes organized by Sarvhitkari Educational Society for students as well as for teachers. This is apart from the holiday book test. Programmes organized by the society are announced from time to time and students are obliged to join these programmes.



Promotion

Promotion to next class is made strictly in accordance with CBSE guidelines. A child is promoted to higher class considering the following:

- He / She gets at least 33% in aggregate in-periodic and Term Exam. He/She will be given one more chance to clear, failing to which he/she will have to repeat the class.
- He / She satisfies the minimum condition in attendance.
- He / She has cleared the minimum requirement in SUPW.

Withdrawal

A parent can withdraw his ward at the end of the session but he should inform about the same by the end of February. A format, available in the office is to be filled up by the parent as request for withdrawal.

All dues of the school should be paid in full and library books returned before applying for a school leaving certificate.

Medium

Medium of instruction is English for all the subjects.

Syllabus

The syllabus designed by NCERT Delhi is followed.

Result / Examination

Continuous assessment of a student's performance is determined by his / her performance in Class tests Periodic tests and Term exams.

Discipline

The students are obliged to follow the school rules and regulations designed from time to time. Any student found guilty of any offence will be expelled from the school for a particular period or may be rusticated depending upon the offence.

It is mandatory for students to come dressed in complete school uniform, failing to which a student may have to face suspension from the classes.

During School Hours

- a) Vandana** The school starts with vandna to mother Sarasvati.
- b) Class** After prayer the students are supposed to go to their respective classes in line where their turnout is checked by the teachers coming for the first period. Defaulters may be fined.
- c) Mid day Break** There is a Break for 20 minutes at the mid of the school hours, Students take their lunch during this time in their classes with Bhojan Mantra at the start.
- d) Subject Taught** English, Hindi, Punjabi, Maths, EVS, Art and Craft, Computer, Yoga ,Sanskrit and Music.

Senior Secondary

A Student has to study one language and opt any four subjects out of the following:-
Physics,Chemistry ,English, Maths/Biology, Physical Education, Computer/Music,Accountancy,Business Studies,Economics, Punjabi,Political Science,Geography.

- e) Sports** : There is a provision for all types of games. P.T. is compulsory for all students and there is a definite schedule for the same.The school has well qualified PT instructors.
- f) Hobbies** : A student is asked to take at least one hobby during his/ her stay in school.
Hobbies:-Painting,Dramatics ,Music,Gardening, Art and Craft,Band and Dance etc.
- g) SUPW** : It is compulsory activity for all boys and girls and is organized at class level.A Cumulative record is kept and considered at the time of promotion.
- h) Library** : There is a well stocked computerized Library with Fifteen thousand books
There is a separate reference section for higher information about different topics.There is a period in a week in every class for the library.
- Reading Section** : This is for newspapers and periodicals.Almost all types of periodicals for this age group of children are subscribed.

- 1) Students are not permitted to bring automobiles and mobile phones in the school.
- 2) Special fine will be levied for being absent without prior permission on particular occasions or during the period especially important from learning point of view.
- 3) Visitors are requested first to contact the school office before meeting the Principal or teachers. They are requested not to go straight to them & thereby cause inconvenience.
- 4) The Wards of school employees have to pay Rs.250/- per month as tuition fee.
- 5) Cases of orphan children or without proper means of support will separately be considered for fee concession.
- 6) Half day leave is not allowed.
- 7) No leave will be sanctioned during Periodic, term and Annual Examinations.

Science Fair and Exhibition

To increase the interest of students in Science, Exhibitions are organized every year after summer vacation to exhibit the project work done by the students. Science Fair is organised by Vidya Bharti at State, Kshetra and All India level.

PEC India

To learn through games, school has introduced new Physical Education Cards as per CBSE. The motive behind these cards is to develop different skills-Agility, Balance and Co-ordination. These activities are linked to other subjects.

PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE

GENIUS EXAMINATION - Sarvhitkari Educational Society (Regd.) has been organising "Genius Competitive Examination" since 2016 in order to develop competitive spirit among the students. The Students of class 8th, 10th and 12th appear for the examination. Toppers are given cash prizes amounting to Rupees 1 lakh.

SARVHITKARI SUPER 100 - It is true that a strong foundation is needed to erect a huge and grand edifice. In order to strengthen the foundation of students, Sarvhitkari Education Society has started a pre-foundation course named "Super 100" for meritorious students of classes 6th to 8th. It is being run through online mode under the guidance of Scientists from ISRO / DRDO. Around 119 students are taking the benefit of these classes.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE COURSE - In order to develop the inter - personal communication skills, different types of trainings are organised by SES. Simultaneously, the society has organized online classes of German Language Course in which 29 teachers of different CBSE schools successfully participated and were awarded certificates. More courses are in the pipe line.

SANSKRITI BODH PARIYOJNA - Different types of programs are organised from time to time by Vidya Bharati at all India level under the aegis of Sanskriti Bodh project, so that our students, teachers and parents get information about our rich Indian culture and values. Special programs like Quiz, essay writing competitions of teachers and students are organized. Apart from these, a special test named Sanskriti Gyan exam is also conducted. During the last three years the society made special efforts to reach out to other schools . These efforts bore fruit and apart from 124 Sarvhitkari schools, 464 different schools also participated in this examination.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT - It is a process of identifying skill gap and ensuring students to develop skills. Sarvhitkari Educational Society (Regd.) has decided to Introduce skills, namely Artificial Intelligence, Beauty & Wellness, Handcraft etc. for students of classes 6th to 8th during session 2022-23 and vocation courses for 9th to 12th students as per guidelines of the respective education board.

NEP 2020 - Provisions of national education policy 2020 will be implemented as per government guidelines.
